



D-Day Commemoration Planned

Mark your calendars for an event paying homage to the bravery and sacrifice of our veterans on a day that shaped the course of world history. Join Fort Miles Museum and Fort Miles Historical Association to salute D-Day on Saturday, June 8. The ceremony will be held at 11 a.m. at The Overlook Venue outside the North Gun Room overlooking the Atlantic Ocean.

The poignant tribute will be led by a color guard from VFW Mason Dixon Post 7234. The names of 40 Delawareans who made the ultimate sacrifice during the D-Day landings at Normandy will be solemnly read aloud. Each name will be saluted with the tolling of a bell, a heartfelt gesture of gratitude for their World War II service.

After the ceremony, Fort Miles Museum will open to welcome visitors from noon to 4 p.m. Guided tours will be offered at 12:30 p.m. and 2 p.m. for \$6.

Don't miss this momentous occasion to honor the valor of our D-Day veterans, commemorating a pivotal moment in world history.

Burke's artwork is particularly touching because sand from Omaha Beach in Normandy, which he collected on the 75th anniversary of the landings, is embedded in the painting. The occasion underscored the bonds of art and history that unite us. Board member Jim Pierce gratefully accepted the painting on behalf of Fort Miles.


