In spite of uncertain weather there was a great turnout in the Ft. Miles barracks area (cantonment area) on Saturday April 26th. There were over 1000 visitors that experienced the soldier's life during WWII at Ft. Miles. There were 125+ American, German and Russian reenactors, about 30 WWII vintage vehicles, including a Sherman Tank, displays in all of the barracks and music in the Orientation Building. Over 300 guests also walked up the hill and toured the Museum.

Spring Wall Of Honor Ceremony

Some of you may be aware of FMHA's long standing paver purchase program that is used to honor veterans and other's service to the United States. While most of the pavers honor WWII vets there are many honoring the service of those who served in in Korea, Vietnam and the Gulf conflicts.

Twice a year FMHA holds a ceremony to honor those individuals whose family and friends purchased a paver for them. This Spring it was on May 4th in the north gun room of the Museum, and over 50 people attended with 10 family members speaking about their honoree.

Note that the Wall of Honor recipients' stories are chronicled on a kiosk next to the display in the Museum, and on-line, which can be seen by anyone with access to a computer.






Member Day at Fort Delaware

D-Day Remembrance at Ft. Miles

The Fort Miles Historical Association will host its fourth annual D-Day Remembrance Ceremony at Fort Miles Museum in Cape Henlopen State Park on Friday, June 6th. The ceremony to honor D-Day veterans starts at 10 a.m. on the museum's event venue outside Battery 519's north gun room overlooking the Atlantic Ocean. This ceremony salutes a signature day in world history and honors all those who participated.

After the ceremony, the Fort Miles Museum will be open until 4 p.m. On display in the north gun room will be the Chaplain's kit that went ashore at Normandy with U.S. Army Chaplain Captain Morris Arnold on D-Day. Also on display will be a special rendering of the Normandy memorials by local artist Paul Rendel. Exhibit rooms in the north end of the museum, including the art gallery and gift shop, may be visited at no charge to the public.

Docent-led guided tours of the south end of the museum, which recreates the WWII working environment of Battery 519, will be offered at 12:00 p.m. and 2:00 p.m. Tours are \$6 per person; there is no tour charge for veterans, active-duty service members or FMHA Members.

Expanded Hours at the Museum this Summer

For at least 8 years FMHA has opened the Museum from May through September on Sundays to supplement Delaware State Park staff (DSP) who only have the resources to open from Tuesday through Saturday.

Starting on May 19th through Labor Day, FMHA will also open the Museum on Mondays. So, by mid-June the Museum will be open 7 days per week!

Here is the schedule:

May 18 – June 14

 - o Tours 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.
- DSP Fridays and Saturdays, 10:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m.
 - o Tours 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.

June 15 – September 7

- FMHA Sundays and Mondays, 10 a.m. 3 p.m.
 - o Tours 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.
- DSP Tuesday Saturday, 10:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m.
 - o Tours 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.

FMHA does not accept reservations for tours, but we never turn anyone away who arrives 10 minutes before tour times.

Delaware State Parks does accept reservations for tours. FMHA volunteers work almost 25,000 hours a year: as Bunker Busters restoring and maintaining the buildings, developing and building displays; as Docents giving tours and guiding visitors at special events; and as Associate Staff managing the gift shop, lecture series, special events, membership, website and electronic displays.
