Lecture Series

November 15, 2025, SOSUS – The U.S. Navy Sound Surveillance System Presented by Navy Capt. (Ret) Bill Manthorpe

The presentation will cover the development and operation of the Navy sound surveillance system (SOSUS) from the 1950 's through the 80 's. Originally designed to track Soviet submarines off the coast of the U.S., Fort Miles (NAVFAC Lewes) was the home for one of the SOSUS tracking stations.
