The 155GPF is Here!!



If you are a FMHA Member, you also receive copies of the Fort Miles Museum Dispatch. In December's issue there was a story about the acquisition of a new piece of artillery, the 155 GPF. This is an example of the first weapon to be placed at Fort Miles at the beginning of WWII. While the article points to the several organizations that made this acquisition possible, it's important to note that FMHA was the lead. Our volunteers have been actively looking for this gun for over 15 years. Our volunteers made the overture to the American Legion Post in Ohio that had it, convinced them to trade it for another weapon that was on display at Fort Miles, made arrangements through personal contacts with the Mahan Foundation to transport and restore the weapon, prepared the weapon that we traded and funded the whole process, at a cost of approximately \$20,000, not including tens of thousands of other in-kind donations of material and labor.

Your organization, FMHA, made this all happen!! And your membership dues and donations allow us to do this. And, we will keep doing it with your support.

Lecture Series Continues

Our next lecture will be held in the North Gun Room of the Fort Miles Museum on January 17. Your registration notice will indicate that you should come into the museum main entrance.

January 17, 2026, The Berlin Airlift: First Victory of the Cold War
Presented by FMHA Historian Ed Paterline

The talk will cover the history of the Airlift and the impact of the Airlift on subsequent US actions in the Cold War era. Dover Air Force Base is the home of the Air Mobility Command Museum and houses a C-54 used during the Airlift. Ed's father flew the Berlin Airlift and Ed and his father attended the 50th Anniversary celebrations in Berlin and met many of the participants.
